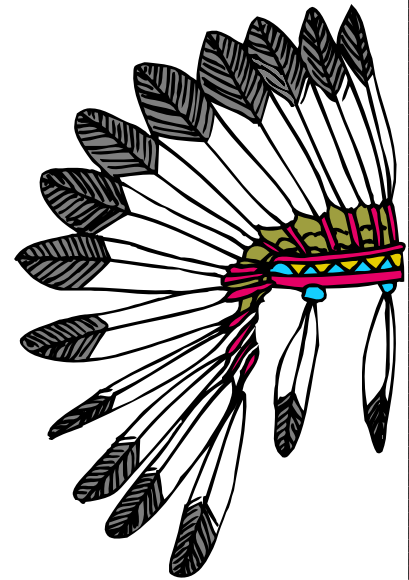

Ya Ta Hey Mighty Papoose Nation,

The Papoose Nation is rested up this month after a GREAT start to the program year. I hope your tribe had a meeting or two since the campout.

November and December is full of activities: the Turkey Shoot on Nov. 7th, Federation Community Day on Nov. 14th, the Papoose Train Ride and Stockyards on Nov. 21st, Arlington Parade of Lights on Dec. 6th, and the Papoose Christmas Party on Dec. 13th. I hope you can also find some time to have a tribe meeting or two over the next few months as well. Tribal meetings can be combined with one of the events, like going out to lunch after Community Day together as a Tribe. Please come be a part of all the events you can. Each event is fun and allows planned time for dads and children to spend time together.

The Turkey Shoot is right around the corner. It is time to start coloring you targets and get ready to hunt down and shoot your turkey. Targets can be downloaded from the resource page of the Papoose Nation Web Site, the URL is listed below. The Turkey Shoot is held each year In Gardens Park located just south of the Dalworthington Gardens Police Department, 2600 Roosevelt Dr., DWG, TX 76016. We are grateful to the Police Department of DWG for allowing us to hold this event in their city.

One of the events that have the greatest impact on the community is the Federation Community Day which is on November 14th. This event will take place at Mission Arlington. The entire Federation will come together and help sort can goods for use in Thanksgiving Day meals that Mission Arlington distributes on Thanksgiving Morning. Last year Mission Arlington provided over 6000 families in need a Thanksgiving Day meal. The total number of people served last Thanksgiving was over 22,000. So Tribes start collecting cans to bring and get ready to help Mission Arlington provide Thanksgiving to over 6000 families! Each year Mission Arlington tell us they could not get all the cans sorted with our help!

You can also help deliver a meal or meals on Thanksgiving Day. Starting at 8 AM on Thanksgiving Day, just drive up to Mission Arlington and tell them how many meals you would like to deliver. Each meal is boxed up and a map is provided with directions. All you have to do is deliver the meal and wish the family a Happy Thanksgiving.
